Following the founding of the Central European University by the Hungarian–American philanthropist George Soros, CEU Press was established in 1993. During the first fifteen years, the publishing program of the Press primarily focused on issues of Central and Eastern Europe, with a special emphasis on the precedents and consequences of transition from communism to democracy and market economy, but as CEU’s academic and social activities have changed to reflect its increasing global engagement, it has had implications for the orientation of the Press as well.

Reflecting the intellectual strengths and values of its parent institution, the Press now publishes books on the political philosophy and practices of open society, history, legal studies, nationalism, media studies, human rights, conflict resolution, gender studies, Jewish studies, economics, medieval studies, literature, international relations, higher education, and public policy.

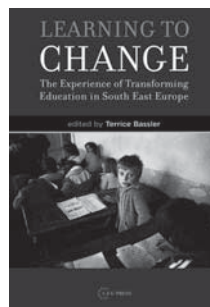

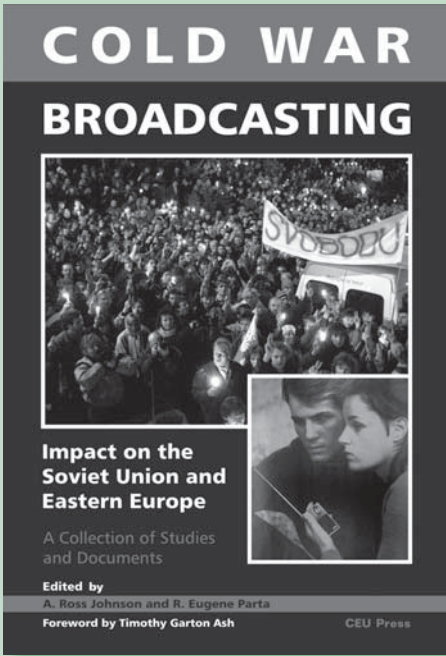

Examines the role of Western broadcasting to the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe during the Cold War, with a focus on Radio Free Europe and Radio Liberty. It includes chapters by radio veterans and by scholars who have conducted research on the subject in once-secret Soviet bloc archives and in Western records. It also contains a selection of translated documents from formerly secret Soviet and East European archives, most of them published here for the first time.

Previous studies have examined the history and organization of Radio Free Europe and Radio Liberty and its place in American national security strategy. What has been lacking until now are studies of the impact of Western Cold War broadcasting, on both societies and Communist regimes, that draw on archival material from the other side of the former Iron Curtain.

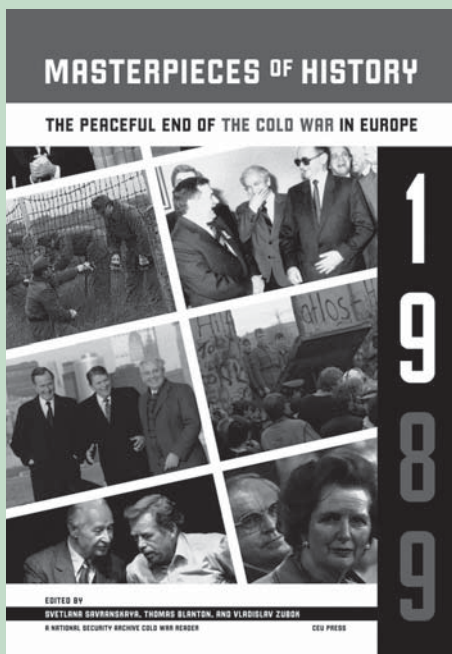

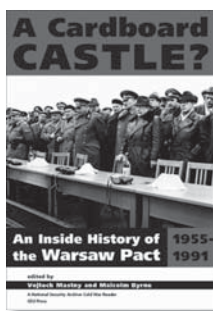

Twenty years in the making, this collection presents 122 top-level Soviet, European and American records on the superpowers' role in the *annus mirabilis* of 1989. Consisting of Politburo minutes; diary entries from Gorbachev's senior aide, Anatoly Chernyaev; meeting notes and private communications of Gorbachev with George H.W. Bush, Margaret Thatcher, Helmut Kohl and François Mitterrand; and high-level CIA analyses, this volume offers a rare insider's look at the historic events that culminated in the collapse of communism in Eastern Europe and the end of the Cold War.

Complementing the documents is the inclusion for the first time of the proceedings of an extraordinary face-to-face mutual interrogation (with scholars and documents) in 1998 of Russian and American senior former officials – Gorbachev advisers Anatoly Chernyaev and Georgy Shakhnazarov, Shevardnadze aide Sergei Tarasenko, U.S. Ambassador Jack Matlock and CIA chief Soviet analyst Douglas MacEachin – aimed at assessing and explaining Moscow and Washington's policies during the miraculous year of 1989.

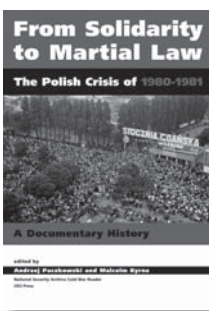

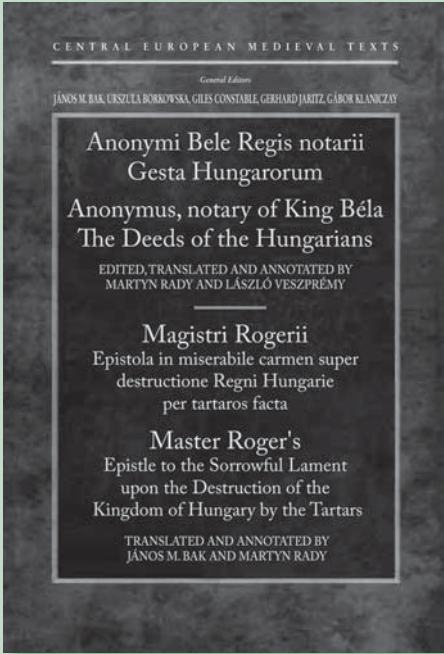

Contains two very different narratives; both are for the first time presented in an updated Latin text with an annotated English translation.

An anonymous notary of King Béla of Hungary wrote a Latin *Gesta Hungarorum*, a literary composition about the mythical origins of the Hungarians and their conquest of the Carpathian Basin. Anonymus tried to (re)construct the events and protagonists – including ethnic groups – of several centuries before from the names of places, rivers, and mountains of his time, assuming that these retained the memory of times past. One of his major "inventions" was the inclusion of Attila the Hun into the Hungarian royal genealogy, a feature later developed into the myth of Hun-Hungarian continuity.

The *Epistle to the Sorrowful Lament upon the Destruction of the Kingdom of Hungary by the Tartars* of Master Roger includes an eyewitness account of the Mongol invasion in 1241–2, beginning with an analysis of the political conditions under King Béla IV and ending with the king's return to the devastated country.

Examines the theoretical and practical outlook of forensic physicians in Imperial Russia from the 18th to the early 20th centuries, arguing that the interaction between state and these professionals shaped processes of reform in contemporary Russia. It demonstrates the ways in which the professional evolution of forensic psychiatry in Russia took a different turn from Western models, and how the process of professionalization in late imperial Russia became associated with liberal legal reform and led to the transformation of the autocratic state system.

Demonstrates the processes by which legal, social, and institutional authority was invested in disciplinary, scientific knowledge, and how these processes were linked to the shaping of a particular vision of legality. Identifying the ways in which social actors merged legal reform efforts with their professional objectives, it argues that this interrelationship was productive of a particular occupational perspective and course of reform, rather than an underdeveloped shadow of developments in Western, liberal states.

Explores patterns of interaction between the mass media and identity formation in the context of Europeanization. On the one hand, the major contribution of the volume is a comprehensive framework that considers media impacts on four levels of identity: European, regional, national, and ethnic minority identities. On the other hand, authors offer cutting edge analysis of the structural transformation of European media institutions, and policies that shape the future of European media.

The book conceptualizes how transnational European publics should and could be created in an environment that does not feature any significant pan-European commercial and public service media as we know these institutions from the experience of nation states. Normative conceptualizations of the European publics are juxtaposed to empirical analyses of editorial practice, i.e., the ways journalists and political elites actually represent European matters in their respective national media.

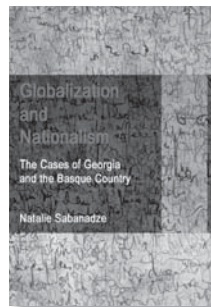

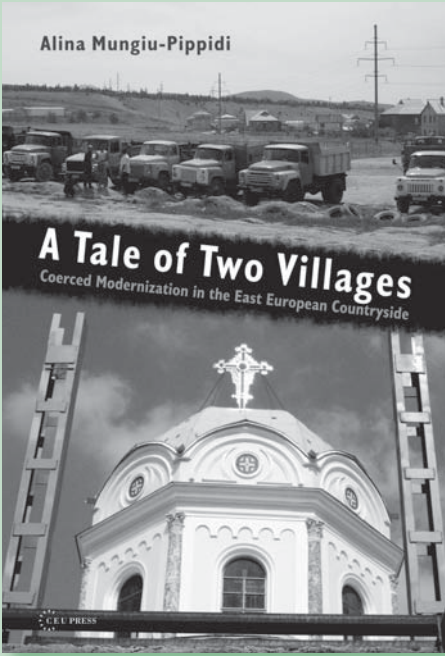

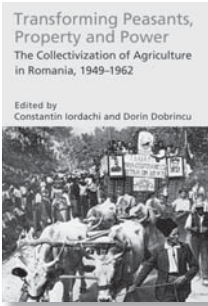

Based upon the history of two Romanian villages, the book examines social engineering in rural Eastern Europe under the Communist regime. One of the two villages is the birthplace of Nicolae Ceaușescu, the former Communist dictator, Scornicesti, which received massive investment during communist years and was turned into a mixture of underdeveloped village and industrial town. The other is Nucsoara, a rebel village, the Carpathian cradle of peasants' resistance against Communism, where half the village was executed or imprisoned and their lands divided between the other half. The state intervention failed in both villages to attain the planned objectives, but it nevertheless changed fundamentally the life of villagers.

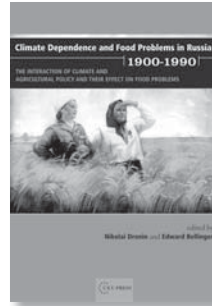

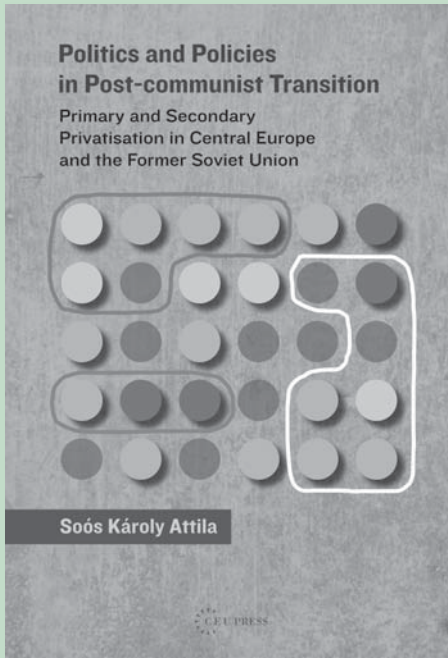

Discusses the policies, practices and outcomes of privatization in six transition economies: the Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland, Russia, Slovenia and Ukraine, paying particular attention to cross-country differences and to interrelations between the processes of privatization and the political transition from communism to a new system.

The analysis is restricted to the privatization in those fields where its methods have been strongly different from privatizations in advanced market economies and where differences of privatization principles and techniques among our six countries were also rather various. This is basically the privatization of middle-sized and large enterprises, not including banks, non-bank financial companies, natural monopolies and agricultural entities. Secondary privatization stemmed from the fact that, in most of these countries, privatization largely consisted of the distribution of property rights free of charge or at a low price among favored groups of the population.

The Order of Saint John – the Knights Hospitallers – is one of the oldest surviving religious orders. In the middle ages it had its headquarters in the East but its activities there depended for men, money and political support on its Western preceptories and priories. Most of them relied on local materials without utilizing the Order's central archives, the remains of which are now on Malta. There have, more recently, been books on priories which partly made use of the Malta documents. The work of Zsolt Hunyadi is a further addition both to the study of particular Hospitaller priories and to the history of the order as a whole. A major problem faced by the author was the dramatic loss of archives and documents in Hungary, a difficulty which he laboured admirably to counter in Malta and elsewhere. In one way, it is precisely because developments in the Hungarian priory were so different from those elsewhere that Hunyadi's work is of such interest.
